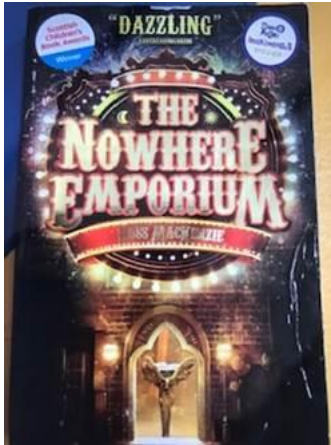

## KS2

It would be really beneficial if you/ your child could also comment on their thoughts about what they have read, a synopsis of what they have read or even a recording of them reading.

3.2.21 – read to page 21. The opening was really good. I want to see what happens next.

4.2.21 – read to page 46. Peter has met a creepy old man that he keeps bumping into.

6.2.21 – Chapter 7. Peter has been given a box with a blue marking pen, a carrot and a set of instructions. He has to somehow change a rabbit's colour. This is exciting and makes me want to carry on reading.

7.2.21 – audio comment.

18.2.21 – book finished! 5 stars!! It was a great book! I found this book exciting because it seemed that all hope was lost but they found a solution. I would highly recommend this book and I'm looking forward to reading other books in the series.
