Due to exceptional circumstances priority should be given to ensuring that pupils can perform safe self-rescue even if they do not fully meet the first two requirements of the NC programme of study.</p> <p>Due to lockdown restrictions in January/February 2021 during term 3 (the schools allocated swimming period at the local pool), the school was unable to deliver swimming lessons in the 2020/2021 academic year. Swimming data has been taken from the previous academic year when the year 6 cohort was year 5.</p>
