



CHARGES and FEES - 2023 – 2024

We have kept our nursery fees and club charges at the same rate over the last academic year, but due to the cost of living increase and increase in costs of wages etc. we are now having to increase the charges we make for extra curricular activities, clubs and nursery. We have tried to keep the increases as low as possible. Please see the table below for our new charges, which come into effect on 1st September 2023

Nursery Fees :

2 year old - £5.93 per hour - £17.79 per session - Lunch club - £3.73 per session
3-4 year olds - £5.62 per hour - £16.86 per session - Lunch club - £3.40 per session
Nursery Snacks – 25p per session attended per week

Breakfast Club :

2 year olds - £5.88
3-4 year olds - £5.62
School aged pupils - £4.20

After school club :

2 year olds - £8.90 to 5pm and £15.20 to 6pm
3-4 year old - £8.40 to 5pm and £14.15 to 6pm
School aged pupils - £7.15 to 5pm and £12.10 to 6pm

Activity clubs: School Age Children only - £4.20 per session

Musical Instrument tuition (per term of 11 lessons): Children from year 2 - £87 per term

Parents may pay a voluntary contribution into our School Games Fund of £25 per family per year although the Annual Sponsored Syresham Mile which all pupils take part in funds the School Games Fund. This fund is used to buy incidental items through the year including cookery ingredients and other items for classroom activities, e.g. food tasting and science experiments.

We make charges to cover the cost of transport and any entrance fees for school trips. Parents on income support etc. may apply to the school for help with these costs. Full details of all trips are sent to parents before they take place.

Parents can make card payments on-line using Eduspot/School Money. A text or email is sent out advising there is an item available with a payment code. The easiest way to book clubs and pay is to download the 'Teachers to Parents' App to be found on the app store (a yellow square with 3 yellow dots in it). Sadly, we are no longer able to accept payments by cash or cheque.

Government funded child care:

The Government will fund children aged 3 to starting school for a universal 15 hours per week which start in the period after a child has their 3rd birthday. Parents may apply for an extra 15 hours per week to total 30 hours. Applications to HMRC need to be made in the funding period before a child turns 3 and then renewed every 4 months
